

HISTORY AND MEMORY: EXILE AND RESISTANCE

We live in times of «forgetfulness», of stressful and «unnatural» acceleration due to a clinging of life to new technologies that make messages, information and what we want to say more ephemeral, under the pretext that everything will be stored in a memory stick as truth. In this «digital time» there is no room for reflection or experience. Walter Benjamin tells us that the historian reconstructs the past, but memory constructs its meaning. We will therefore work on the memory of European exiles, which have not stopped growing with Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which shakes the foundations of Europe. From Berlin to the Pyrenees was the path of exile from north to south, it stopped for a few years in Paris, sending refugees from central Europe, Germany and Austria fleeing to a safer world than the one offered by the rise of nationalism to power in 1933. Berlin was the cultural epicenter of the Weimar Republic during the 1920s. Literary exiles questioning identity, the search for truth with the New Objectivity, the banality of evil now resurfacing in Europe, German intellectuals finding refuge near the Mediterranean, the need to relocate and travel as a source of inspiration and exile as individual resistance. Lectures, poetry recitals, staged theater and theatrical performances will be held, and a preview of Antoni Ros Marbà's opera «Benjamin at Portbou» will close the festival.
